Dear Parents and Guardians:

This letter is to inform you that a high school student in the district tested positive today for Coronavirus (COVID-19). The student was present in school on Monday, November 9th, 2020. Immediately after being notified of this case, in compliance with guidance from the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH), the district conferred with the school doctor, the Borough Office of Emergency Management, the Glen Rock Board of Health and other school and local officials.

District Contact Tracers will contact staff and students who came into close contact (meaning closer than 6 feet for a cumulative of 15 minutes or more within 24-hours) with the student. If you do not receive a call from one of our District Contact Tracers within the next 24 hours, your child was not in close contact.

As per the <u>New Jersey Department of Health guidelines</u>, schools are only required to close when there is an outbreak. An outbreak in school settings is defined as ..."*two or more laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 cases among students or staff with onsets within a 14-day period, who are epidemiologically linked, do not share a household, and were not identified as close contacts of each other in another setting during standard case investigation or contact tracing.*"

In full accordance with the New Jersey Department of Health guidelines, the high school and middle school will remain on their regular schedule. Only affected high school students and staff will operate **virtually** through Friday, November 20th, 2020 and return to school on Monday, November 23rd, 2020.

We understand the level of concern regarding COVID-19. We encourage parents and students to continue following the <u>Centers for Disease Control & Prevention</u> promoted safeguards, such as:

- Staying home when you are sick;
- Washing hands often with soap for at least 20 seconds;
- Covering coughs and sneezes and properly disposing of tissues;

- Limiting close contact with people who are sick and not sharing food, drinks and utensils;
- Practicing social distancing (staying at least 6 feet apart);
- Wearing a face covering while in school; and
- Continuing to monitor your health for symptoms.

As always, we appreciate our community's support and cooperation. You can assist us by remaining vigilant in your approach to dealing with this health concern. If you have any questions about COVID-19 symptoms, or any other concerns for you or your child, please consult your physician.
