• **Central School:** To celebrate the Souper Bowl, Central's Student Council is collecting cans of soup to donate to the New Jersey Food Bank. They also wore their favorite football Jersey or team shirt last Friday.

 Hamilton School & Black History Month: Mr. Diomede (Hamilton Music Teacher) taught a whole unit on black composers and musicians such as Scott Joplin, Marian Anderson, Florence Price, and Aretha Franklin! // Dina Bolan. 3rd Grade teacher: "We learn about a new Black Hero each day during class meetings through videos or books." // Poopak Mohajer, 3rd Grade: "Every day this week, I am introducing an African American leader/hero.



Then we talk about it in the class. Yesterday, we learned about Harriet Tubman. Today we learned about

Frederick Douglass and we compared the two on their approach towards fighting against slavery." // *Kim McCloskey, 3rd Grade teacher* – "I post a quote and picture from an African American in history daily for our class meeting and we discuss as a class." // *Librarian, Lisa Tomaselli:* We had a PowerPoint presentation on Black History Month & Coretta Scott King Book Awards // *2nd Grade* has talked about a few inspirational people, including Rosa Parks, Ruby Bridges, George Washington Carver, and Jackie Robinson. We've had discussions, watched BrainPop Jr. videos, and read aloud stories. // *Mrs. Winkler* did a project on MLK and inspired one of her students to do a food drive.

• Byrd School & Black History Month: *All of Byrd*, During our daily morning announcements, a quote from a famous African American is read over the PA system. // *3rd Grade:* Students were given a list of famous African Americans to research. After selecting a person of interest, students are writing poetry to honor their legacy. // *4th Grade:* Teachers have been integrating Black History month with their Historical Fiction unit of study. They have been reading books in class and online and discussing the time period (slavery, segregation) while celebrating the achievements of African Americans and all they have had to overcome. Daily quotes from prominent African American figures are shared with students to reflect upon and share their feelings/thoughts. // *Media Center:* In the library we are learning about the Coretta Scott King Book Award and reading inspirational books that have won this prestigious award // *5th Grade:* Students are working on a collaborative "On This Day" Project: Every school day we celebrate and honor



an African American hero who we remember in a special way "on this day". Everyone has a day and they will share what happened *on that day* in Black history and what impact that event or person had/continues to have and teach the class! The second is an at home BHM Biography.
